# OUR PRIORITY BILLS

## HB23-1215 LIMITS ON HOSPITAL FACILITY FEES HEALTH CARE

This bill requires a robust, independent study of the impacts of hospital facility fees on the Colorado health care system, expands transparency to ensure patients know if they will be charged a facility fee, and prohibits patients being charged a facility fee for preventive services. CSP brought to light the patients' stories who were victimized by hospital facility fees. We stood up against corporate hospital systems with more money and more resources to advocate for hardworking Coloradans who deserve health care without hidden fees.

## SB23-213 LAND USE ECONOMIC SECURITY

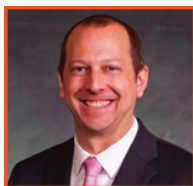
This bill would have established a statewide framework to help communities plan for and develop more affordable types of homes to fit the budgets of more Coloradans. It removes red tape to allow for more housing options and provides guidance to local governments on how to build strategically and limit sprawl, while incorporating affordability strategies and anti-displacement strategies into their planning. To move this bill forward, CSP identified Colorado residents and members of the small business community who are supportive of affordable housing initiatives. We amplified those voices while bringing them to the table.



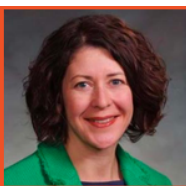

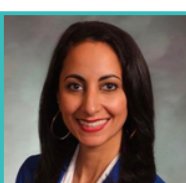

# ECONOMIC SECURITY

While corporations are making record profits, and the rich are getting richer, many Coloradans – folks with good paying jobs – are finding it harder and harder to make ends meet. Our families, communities, and small businesses power our state’s economy. We need to ensure they have the tools and opportunities to not just survive but thrive. Critical legislation was passed in 2023 to grow our economy, protect hardworking Coloradans, and keep money in the pockets of working families.

## **HB23-1091 CONTINUATION OF CHILD CARE CONTRIBUTION TAX CREDIT**

**Sponsors: Rep. Pugliese, Rep. Kipp, Sen. Marchman, Sen. Rich**

This bill helps expand investments into Colorado’s child care system by extending the child care contribution credit, available to those who make certain monetary and in-kind contributions to promote child care in Colorado, through the 2027 tax year.

## **HB23-1112 EARNED INCOME AND CHILD TAX CREDITS**

**Sponsors: Rep. Bird, Rep. Young, Sen. Hansen, Sen. Kolker**

This bill expands Colorado’s Earned Income Tax and Child Tax Credits to help prevent families from falling into poverty as they continue to work hard to make ends meet in the aftermath of the pandemic. By making these tax credits available to those who would be eligible to claim the federal earned income tax credit or federal child tax credit, Colorado is ensuring more hardworking families can live a good life.

## **HB23-1126 CONSUMER REPORTS NOT INCLUDE MEDICAL DEBT INFORMATION**

**Sponsors: Rep. Ricks, Rep. Weinberg, Sen. Exum**

This bill prohibits medical debt from being included on credit reports and protects Coloradans from experiencing unnecessary barriers when trying to access mortgages, car loans, insurance, employment and more.

## **HB23-1192 ADDITIONAL PROTECTIONS IN CONSUMER CODE**

**Sponsors: Rep. Weissman, Sen. Gonzales, Sen. Rodriguez**

This bill updates Colorado’s consumer protection laws and increases enforcement measures to give Coloradans greater protections when purchasing products and using services. It also extends the period where Colorado’s price gouging law applies following a declared emergency.

## **SB23-017 ADDITIONAL USES PAID SICK LEAVE**

**Sponsors: Sen. Winter, Rep. Willford, Rep. Joseph**

This bill expands the cases in which an employee can use accrued paid sick leave. Employees can now use paid sick leave to care for a family member whose

school or place of care has closed due to unexpected occurrences, to evacuate their residence because of an unexpected occurrence, or in the event of a death of a family member.

## **SB23-046 AVERAGE WEEKLY WAGE PAID LEAVE BENEFITS**

**Sponsors: Sen. Winter, Rep. Duran**

This bill requires Family and Medical Leave Insurance (FAMLI) to calculate a covered individual’s weekly benefit amount based on the individual’s average weekly wage from all jobs worked in the base period, instead of only the jobs from which the individual is taking leave.

## **SB23-105 ENSURE EQUAL PAY FOR EQUAL WORK**

**Sponsors: Sen. Danielson, Sen. Buckner, Rep. Gonzales-Gutierrez, Rep. Bacon**

This bill requires the Department of Labor and Employment to investigate and enforce action regarding equal pay complaints, provide legal resources, and update requirements for job posting and employee notification. These provisions will improve pay equity and help ensure Coloradans have an equal standing when pursuing professional opportunities.

## **SB23-172 PROTECTING OPPORTUNITIES AND WORKERS’ RIGHTS ACT**

**Sponsors: Sen. Winter, Sen. Gonzales, Rep. Weissman**

This bill strengthens Colorado’s anti-discrimination laws and broadens the definition of harassment to protect more people from unfair and discriminatory situations in the workplace. The bill specifies that it is discriminatory for an employer to not act in response to a complaint and removes the current requirement of an individual to show that the harassment “was severe or pervasive.”

# HEALTH CARE

Access to affordable, high quality health care is critical to living a long, healthy life. As healthcare costs continue to rise, insurance and pharmaceutical companies are making hefty profits while hardworking Coloradans struggle to afford basic care. Colorado lawmakers passed major legislation to increase access to care and reduce costs.

## **HB23-1071 LICENSED PSYCHOLOGIST PRESCRIPTIVE AUTHORITY**

**Sponsors: Rep. Amabile, Rep. Bradfield, Sen. Simpson, Sen. Fenberg**

This bill will help address Colorado's growing mental health crisis by allowing licensed psychologists, who meet rigorous, additional educational and training requirements, to obtain a license granting them the ability to prescribe life-saving medications.

## **HB23-1183 PRIOR AUTHORIZATION FOR STEP-THERAPY EXCEPTION**

**Sponsors: Rep. Jodeh, Rep. Sirota, Sen. Winter**

This bill aligns Medicaid's step therapy protocols with other health insurance plans so Coloradans on Medicaid can access the medication their physician recommends without having to try and fail alternative medications first, reducing administrative burden, saving money on unnecessary care, and improving health care outcomes for Medicaid recipients.

## **HB23-1224 STANDARDIZED HEALTH BENEFIT PLAN**

**Sponsors: Rep. Brown, Rep. Jodeh, Sen. Roberts**

This bill helps improve the Colorado Standardized Health Benefit Plan, also known as the Colorado Option plan, by bettering the public hearing process, ensuring that insurance companies are held accountable in providing affordable premium rates, and better displaying plan offerings to help consumers find a health care plan that fits their needs.

## **HB23-1225 EXTEND AND MODIFY PRESCRIPTION DRUG AFFORDABILITY BOARD**

**Sponsors: Rep. deGruy Kennedy, Rep. Dickson, Sen. Jaquez Lewis, Sen. Buckner**

This bill makes several changes to the Colorado Prescription Drug Affordability Board to expand the number of prescription medications that can be reviewed for payment limits and allows the board to publish a report summarizing drug affordability data.

## **HB23-1300 CONTINUOUS ELIGIBILITY MEDICAL COVERAGE**

**Sponsors: Rep. Bird, Rep. Sirota, Sen. Zenzinger, Sen. Kirkmeyer**

This bill extends continuous Medicaid and Child Health Plan Plus (CHP+) coverage to children under three until the age of three and people leaving carceral facilities for 12 months, ensuring these populations are not disenrolled

and can remain covered, and establishes a study to examine how best to expand health care eligibility to more under-resourced populations.

## **SB23-195 CALCULATION OF CONTRIBUTIONS TO MEET COST SHARING**

**Sponsors: Sen. Winter, Sen. Will, Rep. Jodeh, Rep. Pugliese**

This bill requires health insurers and pharmacy benefit managers to count any payments for prescription medications made by the covered individual or on their behalf towards the patient’s deductible or out-of-pocket costs, ensuring Coloradans can afford and access their life-saving medications.

## **SB23-288 COVERAGE FOR DOULA SERVICES**

**Sponsors: Sen. Fields, Sen. Buckner, Rep. English, Rep. Joseph**

This bill advances health equity and helps close the racial gap in maternal mortality by initiating steps towards covering doula services for Medicaid patients, establishing a doula scholarship program, and performing an actuarial cost-benefit analysis of doula coverage.

# PUBLIC ENGAGEMENT

Lawmakers have a duty to ensure the system works for hardworking Coloradans and that, no matter what we look like or where we are from, our voices are heard.

## **HB23-1243 HOSPITAL COMMUNITY BENEFIT**

**Sponsors: Rep. Amabile, Sen. Moreno**

As tax exempt entities, nonprofit hospitals are mandated to provide substantial benefits to their communities and address community health needs. This bill increases transparency requirements so communities are more aware of how hospitals are using their tax exempt dollars, improves data reporting protocols for hospitals, and makes it easier for community members to engage and give feedback in the hospital community benefit process.

## **SB23-276 MODIFICATIONS TO LAWS REGARDING ELECTIONS**

**Sponsors: Sen. Fenberg, Rep. Sirota**

This bill increases access to the ballot box by expanding in-person voting opportunities and drop box locations on college campuses and Indian reservations, allowing voters to use digital IDs to vote in-person, improving the ballot curing process, and permitting eligible voters in jail to use tablets to register to vote and cast their ballots. It also makes our elections more secure by mandating a schedule for emptying dropboxes.
